This week in **Reception** we have been learning all about hedgehogs! We have all had lots of fun learning new facts about hedgehogs. Did you know that a baby hedgehog is called a hoglet? The children have worked incredibly hard to use their phonics to write notes using the facts they have learnt. Next week we will be using the notes to write an information page about hedgehogs. In Maths we have been working hard to form numerals 1, 2 and 3.

Year 1 children have been learning the key parts (beginning, build up, problem, resolution, ending' of the story 'We're going to find the mon-



ster'. They did a brilliant job of acting out the parts, creating

freeze frames for them and then making actions to help them to retell the story.



In Maths, **Year 2** have been counting in multiples of 2, 5 and 10. They have been spotting patterns with the tens and ones and using mathematical language to explain this. In English they have been reading the story 'Where the Poppies Now Grow' with a view to writing cinquain poems about war next week.

In Design Technology, **Year 3** have been looking at Bronze Age sculptures this week. We explored clay shaping techniques using our hands and basic tools. In English and Reading, we have also been looking at how we as authors can create an atmosphere in our writing by carefully choosing our vocabulary.

Year 4 This week in English we have been writing poems about Ancient Egypt. We have included poetic features such as alliteration and personification. After writing our poems, we self and peer edited our work to check for spellings, punctuation or to improve vocabulary.



Year 5 This week Year 5 have started learning a difficult Christmas song which is sung in three rounds! It is sounding amazing and they should be very proud of themselves!
