confidence and resilience when it comes to writing. We have also really enjoyed making repeating patterns using colours, objects, noises and actions.




Team Norton love this message and are so proud of Marcus for helping the environment. Also for reducing screen time and taking notice of the beauty in the world around him.

**Year 1** In English this week, the Year 1 children have been thinking of adjectives to describe

what they can hear, see, taste, touch and smell when at a bonfire night event. They all had so many brilliant ideas that they used to create their own bonfire night poem.



In **Year 2** we have been learning about our Christian value 'Friendship'.

We discussed what makes a good friend and identified the qualities we would like in a friend.

We then looked at scenarios and discussed whether the children involved were being a good friend and identified about why/why not.

**Year 4** Our new computing topic is audio editing so for our lesson this week we had a go at recording sentences to play back to the class. We discussed which devices can record and play sound, such as a phone or tablet. After listening to our recordings, we know that we need to talk in a clear voice and have no background noise.



We have been looking at poetry in **Year 3** this week. We've been identifying rhyme schemes, vocabulary that gives us clues about emotions and how poems can tell stories too. In Design Technology we have begun looking at Bronze Age sculptures, evaluating what we like and why.

This week **Year 5** have been learning about Anglo- Saxons. We have enjoyed learning about their gruesome nature and how they came to live in England. Using our Geography skills, we located their journeys and spotted some links between place names then and now.
