


Year 1

In Geography this week, the Year 1 children were looking at maps and their symbols. They did a fantastic job of matching the different symbols to their pictures and loved looking at maps of the local area.

Year 2 In our place value work in Year 2 we have been partitioning numbers. Building on our learning from last week where we partitioned numbers in to tens and ones, we explored different ways of partitioning the same amount.







Year 3 This week in Year 3 we have made edible igneous rocks. These rocks are formed when minerals combine in heat. so we combined sweets with chocolate and melted them together to create a new -delicious- rock.



We also made replica Stone Age paintbrushes using natural materials (and masking tape) which would have been used to paint prehistoric animals on areas of the cave that could not be reached.

Year 4

In science, we planned and set up an investigation into the effects different drinks have on our teeth. We used clean eggshells to represent teeth, placed them into measuring cups and poured different liquids

(water, squash, lemonade, orange juice and milk) on top. We made predictions about what we think the egg shells will look like in a few weeks time.
